This webinar is Intended for frontline workers who encounter clients dealing with Gender-Based Violence (GBV) in their lives as well as for members of the general public who may be neighbors, friends or family members of people who have been victimized by GBV. The webinar provides an overview of the criminal law response to GBV.

Topics covered in this webinar will include:

- What the criminal law can and cannot do in cases of GBV
- Criminal offences related to GBV
- The steps in a criminal case
- The players in the criminal
- system and their roles
- Standard of proof in criminal court
- The role of the victim/survivor
- How the victim can prepare for court
- Services connected with criminal court
- What happens after court is over

Note: All GBV webinars are interactive and will use an intersectional feminist analysis/framework, recognizing that, while men, trans and non-binary folx can be victims of IPV, the victims of the most serious forms of coercive controlling and physical abuse, including lethal violence, are people who identify as women. The workshop focusses on the foundation of Psychological Health and Safety (PHS) at work, and explores 13 factors that have been shown to contribute to a psychologically healthy and safe workplace:

- Organizational culture
- Psychological and Social Support
- Clear Leadership and Expectations
- Civility and Respect
- Psychological Competencies and Demands
- Growth and Development
- Recognition and Reward
- Involvement and Influence
- Workload Management
- Engagement
- Balance
- Psychological Protection
- Protection of Physical Safety

Each factor is examined, and a format is provided for brainstorming, considering, identifying, and selecting actions that could support each factor. A bibliography, list of resources, and list of references is also provided.

The workshop features a scientifically proven intervention model, powerful audiovisual learning aids, group discussions, skills practice and development, and a balance of challenge and safety.

During the workshop, participants learn to:

- Identify people who have thoughts of suicide
- Understand how your beliefs and attitudes can affect suicide interventions
- Seek a shared understanding of the reasons for thoughts of suicide and the reasons for living
- Review current risk and develop a plan to increase safety from suicidal behavior for an agreed amount of time
- Follow up on all safety commitments, accessing further help as needed

The Environmental Monitoring Certificate program equips First Nations students with technical skills and knowledge to conduct environmental monitoring tasks associated with entry-level positions with First Nation or other governments, industry, field researchers or environmental services companies.


In this program, you will learn a variety of methods to collect and record observations, report them to decision makers in a professional manner and repeat to look for change over time. The 10 credit courses are modular and are delivered primarily at remote industrial and research locations around the Yukon in camp settings. Courses are complemented with a number of non-credit safety and operator certifications. The program will normally be completed within two years, with eight-day modules delivered approximately every one or two months, allowing you to continue with work and life obligations while earning your certificate. The program focuses on both western scientific and traditional Indigenous methods of monitoring environmental conditions. Open to First Nations citizens with grade 10-level English and math credits.




Upcoming programming
