

Dual Credit Program Information and Application Package

What is a dual credit?

A dual credit program allows Yukon secondary students to take post-secondary courses while they are still in high school. Dual credit students may also receive elective credit towards their high school graduation which they'll need to confirm with their high school.

What is the benefit of a dual credit?

Participating in a dual credit programming gives students the opportunity to experience post-secondary courses and programming, explore potential career pathways and earn university credits. Students can also prepare themselves for post-secondary by getting some fundamental course work completed while still in high school. In addition, Yukon Education sponsors the dual credit program, so there is **no tuition**! Students need only pay (part-time) non-refundable student union, activity, and technology fees.

How many courses can I take?

Throughout grades 11 and 12 students may take up to a total of 4 dual credit courses. Students and counsellors must ensure that students have enough time in their schedule to accommodate dual credit courses.

Which Yukon University courses are eligible for dual credit?

Any undergraduate level Yukon University course that is part of the British Columbia Council on Admission and Transfer (BCCAT) system is eligible for dual credit (primarily courses in first year <u>General Studies</u>, <u>Northern Science</u>, or <u>Science</u> programs).

Students can determine if an undergraduate course is included in BCCAT by clicking the "check BC transfer options" on each course page. Visit <u>BC Transfer Guide's</u> website where you can search which other post-secondary institutes in BC that will accept your course(s). Who is a good candidate to take a dual credit course?

Dual credit is open to students in grades 11 and 12. They should be mature and prepared to take a university level course. They must have completed any of the prerequisite courses if required.

Do Yukon University courses transfer to post-secondary institutes outside of British Columbia?

Yes, Yukon University also has transfer agreements with <u>Alberta</u>. Yukon University courses have also been accepted at a number of institutions across Canada and the United States. Are textbooks and other extra course materials included in the free tuition?

No, Students are responsible for obtaining the textbook and other materials. Textbook prices can vary, some may be little as \$100, others may be up to \$300.

If a class is not working out, how do I withdraw?

Students may officially withdraw from a course or program without academic penalty until two-thirds of the course contact hours have been completed. See the <u>important dates</u> for the current withdrawal deadline.

A student must submit either an official withdrawal form obtained from the Admissions office, or a dated letter clearly outlining the course name, numbers and sections and signed by the student. Late withdrawals will be considered by the Associate Registrar if extenuating circumstances prevent the student from notifying the University prior to the last day of withdrawal. A grade "W" will be assigned when a student officially withdraws from a course and will not impact grade point average (GPA).

Failure to comply with the proper withdrawal procedures may result in a grade being assigned based on the work completed to the date of the withdrawal or a failing grade (F). Withdrawals will not be accepted without the student's signature.

Student Expectations

Students should:

- Have a free or study block in the semester in which they plan to take the course.
- Plan to spend an additional 10 hours a week doing course work outside of class time.
- Expect to be treated as an adult.
- Have all prerequisites for courses prior to taking dual credits courses and programming.
- Be able to demonstrate maturity and commitment to the program.
- Understand that while they are attending their dual credit classes, they are considered Yukon University students.
