Yukon University Student Financial Awards Faculty Nomination Information Package

Eligibility requirements for faculty nominated awards:

David Jang Memorial Award (1 x \$1000):

- Canadian citizen or permanent resident
- Full-time student (open to those on a full-time permission status)
- Has overcome significant personal challenge (e.g. disability, illness, financial and other challenges as a single parent)

Note: This is a Winter semester award, faculty can nominate at any point until January 31st, and the award will be given out afterwards.

Mines for Minds – Yukon Party Award (\$2000 fund):

- Canadian citizen or permanent resident
- Be one of a Yukon First Nation citizen, an Indigenous citizen, a resident of a community at least 50km outside Whitehorse city limits
- Registered in the Environmental Monitoring program

Note: This fund is accessible year-round, in recognition of the modular nature and remote location of Environmental Monitoring; as eligible students come up, the Environmental Monitoring Program Coordinator will reach out to the Funding Advisor to access the fund.

Paul Flaherty Bursary (2 x \$1000):

- Canadian citizen or permanent resident
- Current residing in Yukon
- Registered primarily in level 020 – 060 level courses, with intent to enroll in a program following upgrading

Note: This award comprises one Fall semester and one Winter semester award; faculty can nominate at any point until October 15th or January 31st respectively, and the award will be given out afterwards.

Prospectors and Developers Association of Canada Award (\$1000):

- Registered for a full-time course load of second year Earth Sciences courses
- Have demonstrated academic excellence the previous year
- Best all-around performance.

Note: This is a Fall semester award; faculty can nominate at any point until October 15th, and the award will be given out afterwards.

Sysco Edmonton Scholarship (\$500):

- Canadian citizen or permanent resident
- Citizen of a Yukon First Nation
- Registered in Culinary Arts
- Demonstrate quality work, leadership and vision in food service, specifically in the area of food safety
- Be planning a career in the food service industry

Note: This is a Winter semester award, faculty can nominate at any point until January 31st, and the award will be given out afterwards.

Naganainlyaa K'itanahee - Follow Your Dream Award (up to \$2000)

- Canadian citizen or permanent resident
- Be of Indigenous ancestry
- Registered in Culinary Arts

Note: This is a Winter semester award, faculty can nominate at any point until January 31st, and the award will be given out afterwards.

Additionally, this award requires a student submission as well, so we request faculty submit this award in collaboration with the student nominee. The student will submit a brief personal statement (written, audio, or video) sharing what draws them to the Culinary Arts program, and how the award would support their future plans.
