- 17 hours dual, including 5 hours Instrument Training, 3 hours Cross-country,
- A minimum of 40 hours ground school including instruction on (Air Law, Meteorology, Navigation and Aeronautical General Knowledge)
- A Transport Canada Flight Test

COURSE FORMAT

Weekly breakdown of instructional hours

Instructional hours for ground school will be set by Alkan air. Flight hours are to be scheduled by the student with Alkan Air.

Delivery format

This course includes classroom instruction (ground school) and hands-on practice (flying hours).

EVALUATION

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All evaluation will be coordinated and administered by Alkan Air. Students may be responsible for scheduling their own evaluation dates/times.
