Graduation Requirements & Yukon First Nations Core Competency

The Practical Nurse diploma, comprised of course work in Nursing and Liberal Arts, is awarded for the completion of the equivalent of two years of full-time study.

To graduate, students must pass all the required courses and:

- complete 50% of the course work at Yukon University; and
- achieve a 64%, 75% or 80% as identified in each course outline and in the term summaries below.

Yukon First Nations Core Competency

Yukon University recognizes that a greater understanding and awareness of Yukon First Nations' history and culture and journey towards self-determination will help to build positive relationships among all Yukon citizens. As a result, all students are required to achieve core competency in knowledge of Yukon First Nations. Content within the Practical Nurse program meets this competency requirement. Students will be expected to begin this process by completing YFN101 prior to the first week of PN classes @ Course: Yukon First Nations 101 (yukonu.ca).
